Daniel Puyo

Deputy Director of Risk and Permanent Control, Crédit Agricole CIB

Daniel Puyo taught at Leeds University in the UK before joining Banque Populaire de la Région Sud de Paris in 1980 as a Sales Assistant then as Deputy Branch Manager.

He joined Union de Banques Arabes et Françaises in 1984, first at the Commitments Department in charge of risk for Europe-Asia-Americas, then as a Banking Consultant for Major French Corporates. Daniel Puyo joined Caisse Nationale de Crédit Agricole (CNCA) in 1988 as Assistant to the Director of the Northern Asia zone, then from 1989 as Head of Business Development of Crédit Agricole for Asia.

In early 1991 he was appointed Deputy Director of International Risks Management, before being posted to the USA in 1993, first to take charge of Distressed Asset Management, and then as Head of the New York branch in 1994. In 1997 he was appointed Managing Director of Crédit Agricole Indosuez Emerging Markets in London in charge of support functions. He returned to the head office of Crédit Agricole Indosuez in 1999 as Deputy Chief Risk Officer, then was promoted to Chief Risk Officer in March of 2008, a position he still holds today at Crédit Agricole CIB.
