



Jean-François Verny

Jean-François Verny began his career in French public service as Auditor at the Council of State. He then became Project Coordinator in the cabinet of French Prime Minister Pierre Messmer, as well as the Defense Ministry Cabinet, before becoming Cabinet Manager at the Secretary of State for Consumer Affairs. Mr. Verny also served as Information Council Secretary on nuclear energy.

Mr. Verny joined Crédit Lyonnais in 1984 as General Counsel and was named the bank's Secretary General in 1986.

He was selected as the CEO of Laydernier Bank, serving from 1992 to 1996. Mr. Verny also has been active in the MEDEF, France's largest employer's union, taking on the position of Vice President for the Legal Commission in 1991, a role that he held until 2004, when he retired.

Jean-François Verny, 66 years old, has a law license and has graduated from Institut d'Études Politiques of Paris. He also attended the Ecole Nationale d'Administration, and has been conference master at the Institute d'Études Politiques of Paris.
